MCMC-East: Last Day To Sign Up Is March 11

Weapons Training Battalion will host the MCMC-East at the Stone Bay Range Complex, March 14-25, 2022. The competition will consist of 10 training days over a two week period. MCIEAST RCO – FY22 DAI Accounts and Procurement Planning Reminders

The Regional Contracting Office (RCO) released local guidance concerning Defense Agencies Initiative (DAI) actions required for contracting and Government Commercial Purchase Chard (GCPC) support on 11 Feb 2022. This notice is a reminder that no later than 15 Mar 2022, all users requiring contracting and GCPC support must have valid DAI accounts in order to receive support from the RCO (excludes Navy, blue dollar requirements). Additionally, the RCO is reminding customers of the upcoming Simplified Acquisition Threshold (SAT) procurement cutoff dates on 2 May 2022 (for service contracts) and 31 May 2022 (for supply type contracts). This advanced notice is to inform customers of executing procurement planning actions now prior to the passage of an approved fiscal year budget and Mid-Year Review funding adjustments. Procurement planning actions can consist of, but are not limited to, developing Independent Government Cost Estimates (IGCEs), Performance Work Statements (PWS), clear and concise requirement characteristics, and justifications for other than full and open competition (brand name or sole source requirements). Military Onesource Miltax – Benefits

Military OneSource provides service members and their families with easy access to a <u>suite of tax services</u>, including <u>easy-to-use tax preparation and efiling software</u> designed to address military-specific situations, and information and resources on a variety of tax-related topics. And it's all free. MilTax assistance includes providing answers to any questions about your economic impact payment or coronavirus disease 2019 tax implications, such as if you are a military spouse and experienced job or wage loss due to COVID-19. With MilTax, there are no hidden surprises.

MilTax Consultations - MilTax consultants have extensive knowledge of the tax benefits for military members, families and survivors, and can help you get all the tax credits and deductions you qualify for. MilTax consultants are specially trained to understand all kinds of military tax situations. Assistance includes:

- Alerting you to tax requirements and deductions related to military life
- Identifying important tax regulations that apply to service members
- Answering your questions so you can confidently complete federal and state tax forms
- Addressing any tax-related questions you have while preparing your federal and state tax returns
- Connecting you to MilTax software for secure online preparation and free tax filing.

MilTax tax preparation and filing services

MilTax free preparation and e-filing software is made to be convenient for the military community. It was developed with the realities of military life in mind — scenarios that civilians rarely encounter — including deployments, combat pay, multiple moves and multi-state filing. This self-paced tax software allows you to:

- Complete and electronically file your federal return and up to three state tax forms
- Check on your electronic filing status.
- Rest easy knowing that a tax software provider is by your side if you get audited.
- Get 100% accurate calculations, or the tax software provider will reimburse you up to \$10,000. Terms and conditions apply.

MilTax e-filing software is easy to use, and free technical assistance is available if you need it. The system protects and safeguards the security and confidentiality of your personal information by using industry-recognized safeguards. For technical assistance, such as login issues, using the software, printing returns, etc., call 855-897-8639 and follow the prompts.

Earned income tax credit

Understand whether you can obtain an <u>Earned Income Tax Credit</u> to put more money in your pocket. These are federal income tax credits for low- and moderate- income working individuals and families. Be aware that:

- The credit can generate a refund if you do not have any taxes to pay.
- Service members and families may have an easier time qualifying for the credit because some forms of military income such as pay earned during service in a combat zone or basic allowances for housing are non-taxable and aren't included as part of your total income.

Volunteer Income Tax Assistance Program

You can meet with a military tax consultant for face-to-face assistance via the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance Program at no cost – for tax advice and preparation, return filing and other tax assistance. This IRS program offers free tax preparation and e-filing at sites on and off base. It also has sites overseas to help military members and their families. Find a Volunteer Income Tax Assistance location near you.

Financial Counseling

Should MilTax consultants help you get a tax refund, schedule <u>a free financial counseling session</u> with Military OneSource to figure out the best way to apply that refund to long-term savings goals. According to the IRS, filers received on average \$2,577 in direct deposit tax refunds in 2019. So if you are expecting to get a refund this year, file early and replenish your savings. And you don't have to wait for your refund in the mail. Through Military OneSource MilTax, you can sign up to get your refund sent straight to your bank account through direct deposit.

Learn the Warning Signs of 'Military Scams'

Your military friend or family member serves our country with integrity and honor. Unfortunately, there are scammers out there who try to take advantage of that service to cheat them and you. You can help protect your service member against military scams by learning the warning signs of schemes that target those in the military community.

Rental Property Scams

These scams target military personnel looking for housing near a base. Scammers pretend to be real estate agents and post fake ads for rental properties on websites, sometimes promising military discounts and other incentives. They try to get service members to send them money for fees and deposits upfront – and the victim ends up with no money and no place to live. If someone insists on receiving money or other payments before a property has been seen, it is probably a rental scam.

DFAS/MyPay Phishing Scams

These schemes try to steal a service member's identity by getting Social Security numbers, bank accounts and other personal information. The scammer pretends to be from the <u>Defense Finance and Accounting Service</u> or another military group and contacts members or their spouses by phone, email or text. They may claim that due to computer problems your information was lost and needs to be reentered to process payments. In other cases, their emails contain links or attachments that can put malware on computers to steal passwords and account information. Your service member should never give personal information on the phone – or click on links in emails – from someone they don't know. Also, DFAS and other military organizations never ask for personal financial information, account numbers or passwords.

Payday Loans

Is your friend or family member having trouble making ends meet? If they are considering getting a short-term payday loan to tide them over, they may be setting themselves up for long-term financial trouble. "Short-term," "personal" or "payday" loans are unsecured loans for small amounts – generally \$500 or less – that charge big interest rates and fees. (A typical two-week payday loan charging \$15 per \$100 borrowed equals an annual percentage rate of almost 400%.) Many payday loan companies operate online and advertise "fast cash" and "no credit required." Active-duty service members are protected from

payday loans by the Military Lending Act, which keeps lenders from gouging military personnel with high-interest rates and fees. The MLA gives service members these rights:

- A 36% cap on interest rates on loans of under three months.
- A lender can't require them to submit to mandatory arbitration or ask them to give up their rights under state or federal laws, as they can with the general public.
- A lender can't make them agree to a voluntary military allotment or automatic repayments from their paycheck – for loan approval.
- A lender can't charge them a fee or other penalty if they pay back their loan

Even with these protections, your service member needs to watch out for lenders who may charge illegally high interest rates and fees.

Loan and Credit Card Scams

Your friend or family member may be considering getting their first credit card or applying for a loan, but they have no credit record. They need to watch out for scammers who offer credit cards and loans with ads saying "Bad credit? No credit? No problem" or "We don't care about your past. You deserve a loan." They may also "guarantee" that they can get anyone a loan or credit card. Here are some of the warning signs:

- They aren't interested in your credit history, even if you have no credit or bad credit.
- They "guarantee" you will qualify for a credit card or loan before you apply.
- They don't disclose fees clearly. Legitimate lenders often charge fees, but they list them upfront.
- They say you've been approved, but demand a fee before you get your credit card or money.
- They ask you to wire money or pay an individual. Legitimate lenders don't do that. Also, don't use a wire transfer service or send money orders for a loan.

Car Sale Scams

If your service member is excited about a great deal they're getting on a new car, ask them for details. Dealers that require no credit check and offer instant approval often charge hidden fees and high interest rates that inflate the cost of a car. First- or second-time car buyers may not be aware of this. Before your member signs a contract, urge them to comparison shop with other dealerships to make sure they're getting a fair deal. And if they're buying a used car, remind them to ask for its repair history and get a mechanic to look it over before purchase.

Family Nutrition Information

Does your family have food insecurities? Food insecurities is defined as the state of being without reliable access to a sufficient quantity of affordable, nutritious food. According to an article from the Center for Strategic & International Studies titled "Food Insecurity among U.S. Veterans and Military Families", "a study published in May 2021, nearly 33 percent of respondents at a major U.S. Army installation were classified as marginally food insecure in 2019. Among nearly 7,800 military family respondents, 12.5 percent were food insecure in 2019, according to the Military Family Advisory Network (MFAN) **Military** Family Support **Programming** Survey. (https://www.csis.org/analysis/food-insecurity-among-us-veterans-andmilitary-families). If you fall into one of these categories, there are resources available for military families. Families with children under the age of 5 may be eligible for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC). If you have children over the age of five you may be eligible for Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP). There is more information below on these programs.

Nutrition Assistance - SNAP provides nutrition benefits to supplement the food budget of needy families so they can purchase healthy food and move towards self-sufficiency. The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) is the largest federal nutrition assistance program. SNAP provides benefits to eligible low-income individuals and families via an Electronic Benefits Transfer card. This card can be used like a debit card to purchase eligible food in authorized retail food stores. To be eligible for this benefit program,

applicants must live in the state in which they apply and meet certain bank balance limits. A household with an elderly (over 60) or disabled household member may have a higher bank balance limit. Visit SNAP's eligibility page to find out more about eligibility requirements and how benefits are computed.

Saving lives requires vigilance. Each tragic loss to suicide has far reaching impact on families, friends, and Marines left behind. At the unit level, suicide effects morale, unit cohesion, and ultimately unit effectiveness and readiness of Marines. Our prevention programs are designed to help Marines who are thinking about suicide or engaging in suicidal behavior, and those who may be at risk for suicide because of a mental disorder, or because they belong to a group with higher rates of suicide attempts or deaths. Services provided are:

- Develop in all Marines the skills needed to recognize and address suicide warning signs, which include appearing overwhelmed by recent stressors; experiencing a fall from glory, loss of honor, and change in status within a unit or relationship; withdrawing from friends, family and society; losing interest in hobbies, work and school; feeling helpless, worthless and trapped in a situation.
- Common risk factors and triggers that should not be ignored are legal or disciplinary problems, relationship problems and financial problems. Substance abuse, behavioral health diagnosis and Permanent Change of Station (PCS) problems appear to increase risk for suicide.
- The DSTRESS Line provides 24/7 phone, chat and Skype line counseling services utilizing a "Marine to Marine" approach.

- Confidential care worldwide ensuring access to behavioral health services and assisting Marines and families in navigating the many support resources available.
- Care coordination and continued 90 day follow-up through the Marine Intercept Program for all Marines identified with suicidal ideation or attempt.
- Conquering Stress with Strength is the newest practical application workshop facilitated by Marine Corps Family Team Building providing skills to effectively respond to high-stress situations that include suicide prevention.

Learn More - Marines, Sailors, and their families may access help directly through Community Counseling Program. There is no wrong door for getting help. Counselors conduct screenings, actively assess needs, provide counseling, and connect Marines and families with additional resources through referrals and direct handoffs between programs and facilities. If you recognize warning signs or believe someone is in immediate danger, call 911 or seek help from a mental health care.
